Minutes of the 28th of July 2011 at Rozel Court at 7pm.

There were 15 residents present.

1. Apologies; Michael Farleigh TPU; Cllr Cathie McEwing; Cllr. Paul Holmes; Emma Bailey (SCC); Paula Windebank (Radian); Julie Gwilt (resident).
2. Because Southern Water were unable to arrange a speaker the agenda was changed to deal with the usual business first and to hold a quiz after the refreshment break. At previous meetings fluoridation had been discussed. Councillor Pope said that there is to be an Open Council Meeting on Wednesday 14th September to debate the situation. The public are welcome to attend but there will be restrictions on speaking and anyone wishing to do so should look on the SCC website for information or contact their councillor. Andrew said that he would probably abstain at the vote as he thinks the public should decide. Gary Waters spoke about his views and personal experience on the subject and the benefits he feels by avoiding fluoride. There is still heated debate on the subject.
3. Minutes of 26th May were read and agreed.
4. Matters Arising; Oasis Academy: Podge said that there seemed to be a problem with the changes of the right of way across 5 acres. There is a challenge that the right procedures have not been followed. Chair asked Councillor Pope if he had heard any more news on the LIDL distribution centre being built in the area. Andrew replied that there had been a mixed response from local residents, some liking the possibility of jobs being created, but there is some debate on how many that be. The date of the event on 5 acres has been changed from the 14th to the 21st August because of a clash with the SKYRIDE in Southampton.
5. Treasures Report; Gary Waters gave his report mentioning that the current account stands at £504. The only outgoings have been on refreshments. WE are about to receive a grant of £1108 towards the event from the community chest and possible help from Radian. Andrew suggested we should Co-op for funding. He will e-mail the details.
6. Paul L gave an update on the August Event. Queens Keep are arranging for their café to be open and a BBQ. They are also helping with equipment and help with marshalling the obstacle course. Paul has approached the Rugby Club to open their premises. Alan Seaman is providing great help. There is to be another sub-committee meeting soon. Podge asked about a bric-a-brac stall as he had been given some items. He and Jane volunteered to run it. There will be a Tombola and we have appealed to residents for donations. There will be face-painting and a Guess the number of sweets in the jar competition and other attractions. Although the kite festival was cancelled it is a possibility that they might be able to bring a kite workshop to the event.
7. AOB. A resident had contacted Chair with her concern about anti-social behaviour in St.Martins Close. The police have been contacted.
8. There was a comfort break followed by the quiz. The lucky winners (clever clogs) were Claire and Penny. They each won a bottle of wine. A draw of contributed prizes was held and there being no further business the Chairman closed the meeting.
